

# NURSE CORPS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



<b>Program Description</b>	The Nurse Corps Scholarship Program provides scholarships to Registered Nursing students, including Advanced Practice Registered Nursing students, dedicated to working in health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses.
<b>Eligible Disciplines</b>	Accepted or enrolled in a professional nursing degree program at an accredited school of nursing located in the United States or U.S. territory: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Diploma School of Nursing</li> <li>• Associate Degree School of Nursing (ADN)</li> <li>• Collegiate School of Nursing (BSN, master's degree, DNP)</li> </ul>
<b>Service Commitment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2-year minimum service commitment for 1-2 years of scholarship support (full-time status)</li> <li>• 1-year additional service commitment per scholarship year for full-time students</li> <li>• Work part-time (16 to 31 hours per week) or full-time (32 hours per week or more) with a minimum of 80% of hours dedicated to direct patient care for at least 45 weeks per year. Part-time work extends the length of service.</li> </ul>
<b>Financial Benefits</b>	Funding for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tuition</li> <li>• Required fees</li> <li>• Monthly support stipend</li> <li>• Annual other reasonable educational costs (e.g., books, supplies, uniforms)</li> </ul>
<b>Tax Liability</b>	Taxable
<b>Where Clinicians Serve</b> The health care facilities listed are Critical Shortage Facilities only if located in, designated as, or serving a primary medical care or mental health HPSA.  Ineligible facilities include, but are not limited to, clinics in prisons or correctional facilities and travel nurse/ nurse staffing agencies.
